## Next Sunday's ceremony at West Park Cemetery MONUMENT TO JEWISH MARTYRS IN EUROPE

THE foundation stone of a monument to the six million Jews who were exterminated by the Nazis in Europe will be laid at the West Park Cemetery on Sunday, August 31, coinciding with the 19th anniversary of the German invasion of Poland. The ceremony will begin at 3 p.m.

Thousands of people are expected to attend the ceremony and pay tribute to the martyrs of European Jewry. The monument, when completed, will be a huge structure showing six hands, holding six Shofrot as a symbol of the six million men, women and children who died on Kidush Hashem during the second world war. In the middle will be an inscription "Thou Shalt Not Kill."

Chief Rabbi Prof. L. I. Rabinowitz will deliver a sermon and Chief Cantor I. Alter will intone the Hazkarah. Two foundation stream will be consecrated: One by the Chief Rabbi on behalf of S.A. Jewry, and one by Mr. Isaac Levinson on behalf of the S.A. Jewish Monument Committee.

Representatives of the Jewish Board of Deputies, S.A. Zionist Federation, S.A. Jewish Appeal and Chevrah Kadisha will read the inscriptions in Afrikaans, English, Hebrew and Yiddish.

Members of the Jewish community are urged to attend the ceremony in large numbers.
