At the unveiling cerenony last week Mr Lionel
Abrams, the master of
ceremonies said that it was
important for the Order to
have the statue in order "to
remind the present generaion that it was because of
the efforts and beliefs of
the early Jewish settlers to
South Africa that the present Jewish community occupied it's position of afluence and prestige".

Mr. Vivian Myersohn expressed the Order's appreciation for the fundraising efforts of Mr Abrams without which the statue could not have been purchased.

He said that he had been told by the wife of the late Herman Wald that the great sculptor had drawn on the memory of the face of his father as the model for the old man. She said that the sculpture was not only in the form of a wise old man blessing his son but also symbolic of the transference of the ancient values Judaism.

In his address Mr Alex Gorshel, a former mayor of Johannesburg and a member of the Order spoke of the friendship that he enjoyed with the late Herman Wald and said that the outstanding characteristic of the man was love. He said that Wald had loved freedom and because of patriotism had joined the army during World War Two even although he was not obliged to do so.

Mr. Benny Ash the grand president of the Hebrew Order of David unveiled the statue.
