EL refuses gift statue

EAST LONDON — A statue by the South African sculptor Herman Wald, which was offered to the Ann Bryant Art Gallery as a gift, has been leclined.

"We would accept it very gratefully if Dr Recsei could deliver it to us, but we feel the cost of transport is prohibitive. There is also a large rack at the base of the piece and we felt that moving it could prove a little dicey." Mr Spring said.

Dr Recsei said the crack was "inconsequen-tial," and added: "As for the transportation costs being prohibitive. I cannot accept that argument.
