

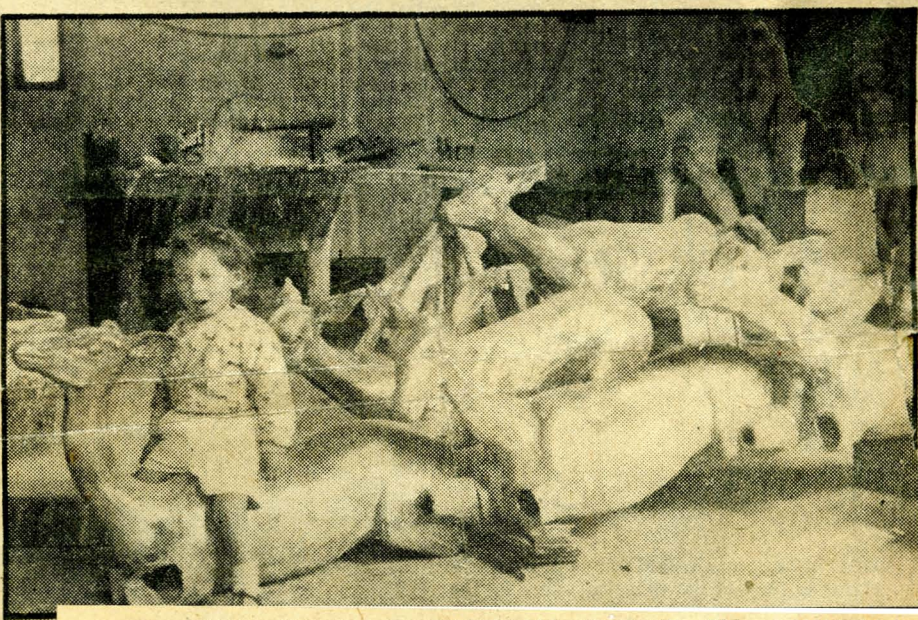

# An Oppenheimer gift to the city



This is a "Rand Daily Mail" artist's impression of the bronze fountain, designed by Hermann Wald, to be unveiled next month on the site of the old Standard buildings, to commemorate Sir Ernest Oppenheimer's association with Johannesburg. The drawing, made from the few details available, represents 18 startled impala leaping across an irregular pool from which jets will be thrown 40 feet into the air. The impala will cover an arc 30 feet across and 13 feet high, which will be supported at the ends only. On the right, Hermann Wald's daughter plays on one of the life-sized impala to be used on the fountain, which is a gift to the city from Mr. Harry Oppenheimer. The fountain will ultimately be transferred to a point facing the City Hall when the Rissik Street Post Office is demolished.
