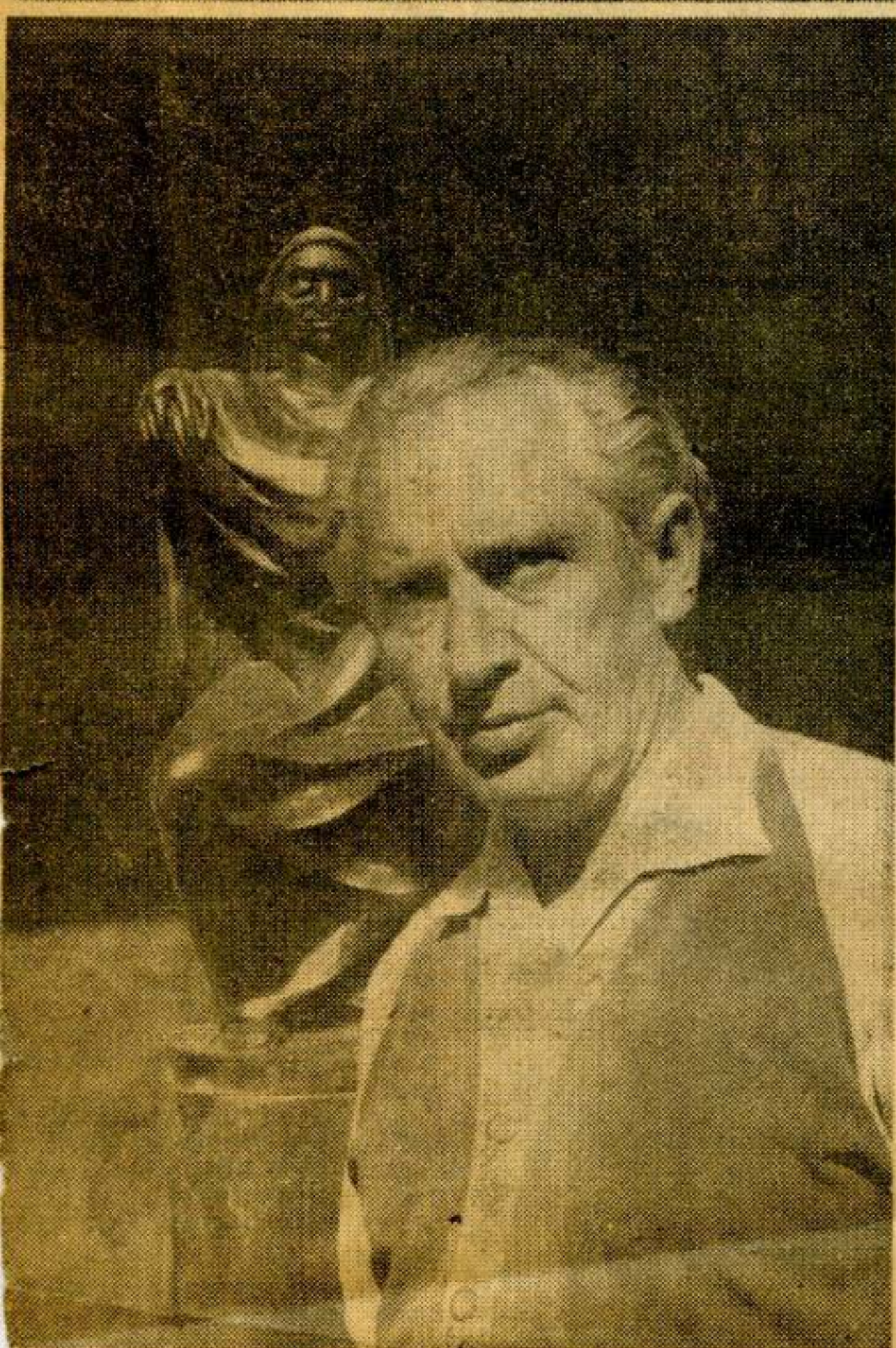
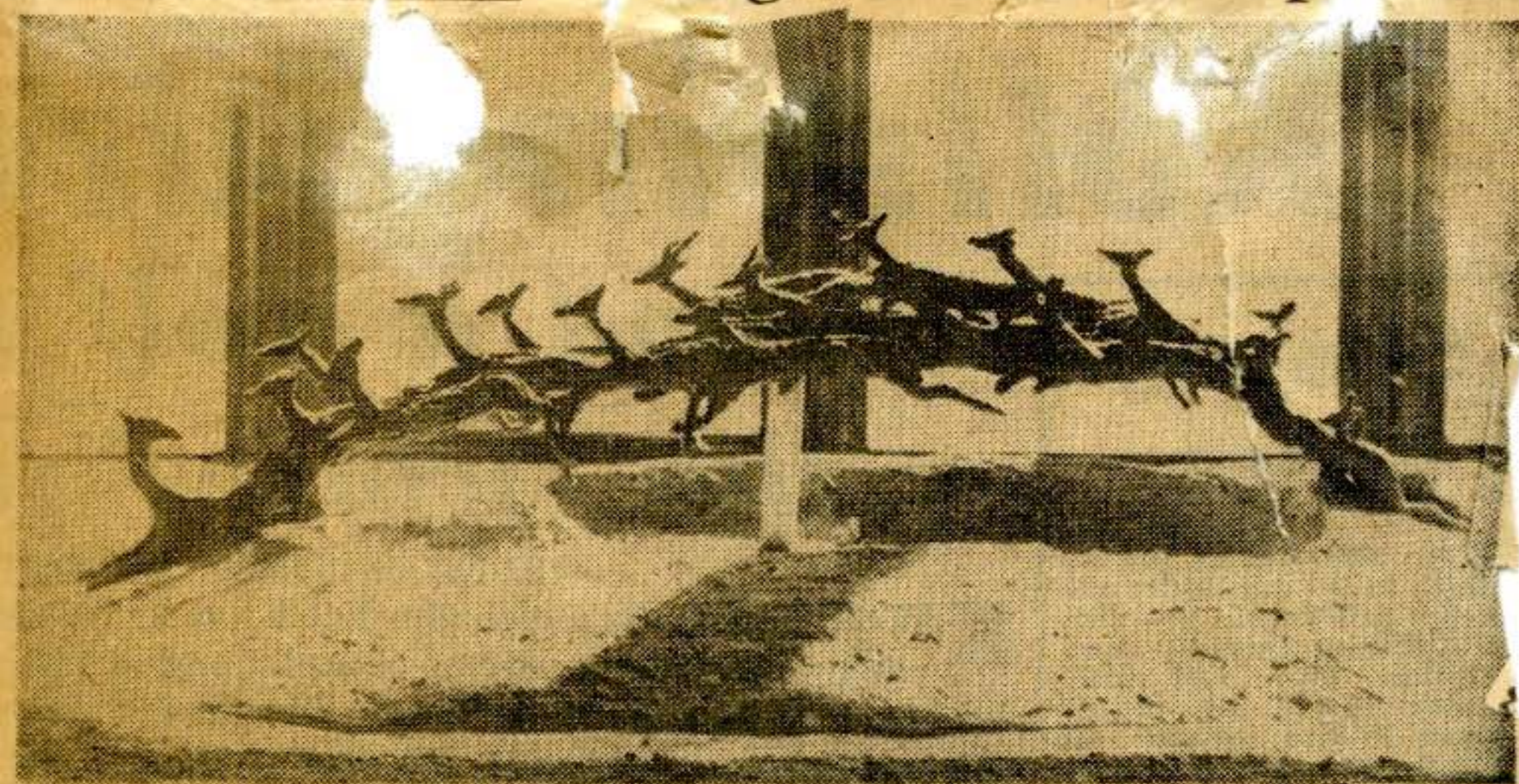

Oppenheimer gift may start new tradition

A NEW tradition in public sculpture in South Africa is expected to flow from the fountain which Mr. Harry Oppenheimer has presented to the city of Johannesburg as a Union Jubilee year memorial to his father, the late Sir Ernest Oppenheimer.

Details of the fountain—which is to be formally opened at 3 p.m. on June 16 on a site now being prepared behind the Rissik Street Post Office—were released by the Mayor of Johannesburg, Mr. Alec Gorshel, at a Press conference on Friday.

Sculptured by Mr. Hermann Wald, of Johannesburg, the fountain will consist substantially of 18 life-sized bronze impala leaping through 40 jets of water in an unsupported arc of 30 ft. rising
