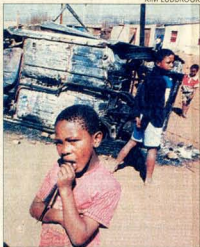

# Schoolteacher shot dead in love triangle

## Impala sculpture to leap right back into Joburg CBD

The long journey of the Leaping Impala sculpture, from Ernest Oppenheimer Park in central Johannesburg, to a gallery, then a garden lawn in Kempton Park, will end early next year when it is remounted in Main Street.

Herman Wald's famous work was given to the city in 1960 by tycoon Harry Oppenheimer, and mounted over a fountain in the park named after his father.

Last year, most of the heads and some of the legs were sawn off. Police recovered one of the 10 missing heads from a Boksburg scrap dealer, and a leg was found in a pawnshop in Johannesburg in November.

The sculpture was taken apart and is now lying in the garden of Mike Wald, an artist and son of the original sculptor.

Wald will remodel the heads and legs, which will be recast in bronze before the work is mounted in a new, more-secure piazza near the Johannesburg Magistrate's Court.
